

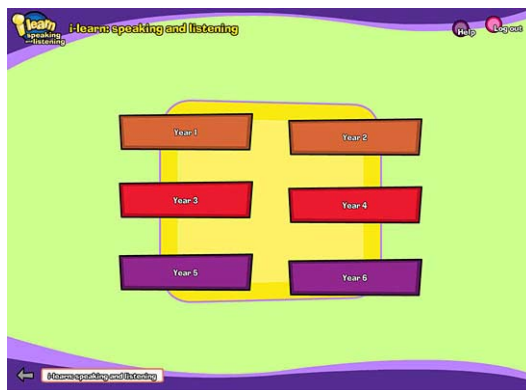


Getting started: *i-learn: speaking and listening*



Simply click on the **Enter** button to access the *i-learn: speaking and listening* teaching screens.

Also note the **Help** and **About** buttons. Click on these for more information about *i-learn: speaking and listening*.



Now you'll need to select a **year**.

The next screen asks you to select a **unit**. Years 1–4 of *i-learn: speaking and listening* contain four teaching units and Years 5 and 6 contain three. Each unit supports a particular speaking and listening skill.

This screen also offers:

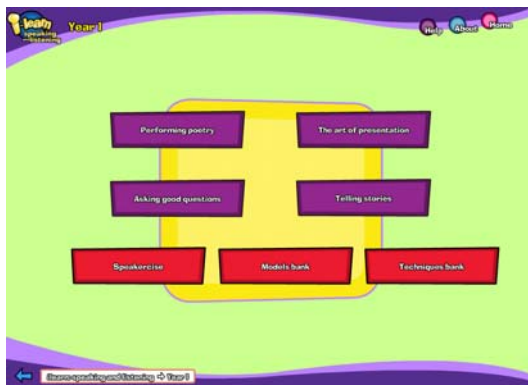
Models bank:

Each **unit** has six **focuses**. Once you have chosen a focus, you can navigate to any activity screen using the blue menu buttons. The first button takes you to the objectives for the focus.

You can navigate between teaching screens using the page numbers or arrows at the bottom of each screen.

There are over 100 teaching screens per year, so there's plenty to choose from! We've designed them to be flexible, so don't feel you need to follow the suggested sequence rigidly.



This is a teaching screen from *i-learn: speaking and listening* showing our standard buttons and icons:

Takes you back to the focus menu.

opens a quick guide to using the screen.

reveals a question to discuss with your class.

indicates where a document from is needed for the activity.



The **Annotations toolbar** provides tools such as a pen, a highlighter, textboxes and speech bubbles, cover and spotlight tools. Your notes will be saved between lessons; you can remove annotations using the Clear annotations tool.



The teacher **Controls** let you change the volume, time activities, print a screen and reset the current screen to its original state.
